Students who audit a course must establish regular attendance and participation; if they will be submitted as a "No Show." No credit is earned for audited courses, but the course name and designation "AU" are listed on the transcript.

Ordinarily, students may not audit studio or laboratory performance-based courses. Students' work in audited classes will not be formally assessed and no grades will be issued. Auditors are expected to read required texts and are permitted to ask and answer questions in class.

Courses taken for audit do not apply toward any academic degree and do not count as part of a student's full or part-time course load for financial aid purposes.


