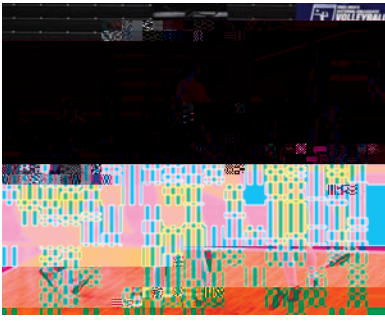




PROGRAMS OFFERED

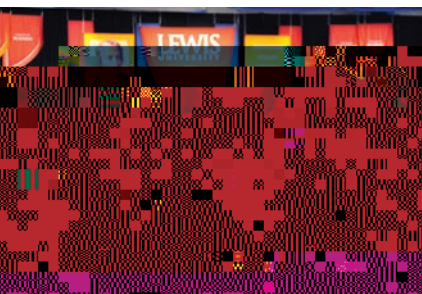

Lewis is one of only 19 colleges in Illinois recognized as a **2019**.

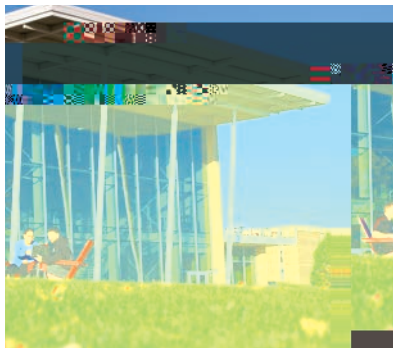
Lewis is the **eighth largest** private University in Illinois.

HISTORY

Lewis University was
It began as the Holy Name Technical School for boys and was established on land donated by Michael and Frances Fitzpatrick of Lockport. Aviation technology became the special emphasis of instruction and the origin of today's highly regarded College of Aviation, Science and Technology.

During World War II, hundreds of Navy flight instructors were trained at Lewis. In 1952, renamed Lewis College of Science and Technology, the school
